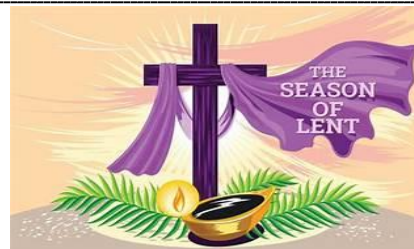

We will learn about labyrinths, do related crafts and activities, and either walk on her travelling labyrinth that will be set up in the sanctuary, or use a finger labyrinth. The event is free. Lent was originally a season for new converts to learn and prepare for their baptism on Easter. During that time, they would study what was central to Christianity. This Lenten devotional began by looking at what was central to Jesus’ life and ministry: radical welcome, love for neighbor, care for the vulnerable, nourishment for the hungry, nonviolence in the face of injustice. At the heart of Jesus’ teachings, there is liberation, love, mercy, and grace—all of which are meant to be very good news for us all.

Jesus’ ministry can be described as “radical” which comes from the Latin word “radicalis,” meaning “root” or “ground.” Therefore, the good news should bring us back to our roots. Emulating Jesus and embodying his teachings should ground us in who God created us to be. Can we be “good news” people in a world too often burdened by bad news? This Lent, let us remember that the good news really is good news. It is joyful—like fine wine saved for celebration. It grows like a mustard seed and smells like perfume poured from an alabaster jar. It tastes like bread passed endlessly through a hungry crowd. It sounds like laughter and feels like mercy. The good news is alive in the world.

Food Pantry/Clothing Closet News

We take pride in bringing food and hope to our neighbors in need.

In the Sunday bulletin we list a food item that the food pantry needs. The item changes each month. The item for December is canned soup. The item for January will be canned fruit.

In December the food pantry served 107 families, which consisted of 219 adults and 109 children. We welcomed 9 new guests. There were 5 Mondays in December. Our numbers seem to be declining a bit.

We received 54 donations from members, neighbors, companies and another food pantry.

We are so grateful to our volunteers. We have 26 volunteers of which 5 are not members of Resurrection. Our volunteers gave 308 hours of their time working very hard to make this ministry successful. Everyone is invited to stop in on a Monday morning to see hard our volunteers work.

We have received an enormous amount of clothing donations and need volunteers to help sort through all of the approximately 30 bags and eliminate the ones that are not suitable to offer to our guests. Please contact Linda in the office or Sue Koevenig if you can help.

Thank you to those who have stepped up to help.

Our Outreach committee is looking into a possible fundraiser.

Dec results show a gain in our investments of \$175.29. Envelope income was under budget by (\$1,071.42) for the month & under budget (\$45,072.00) for the year. Expenses were under budget by (\$814.33) for the month & under budget by (\$5,922.31) for the year. Our cash position as of 12/31/25 is \$81,561.45 in total cash assets, spread across our Money Market Fund, CD and Checking Account. Of this cash, we have \$55,265.83 to pay church expenses and \$26,295.62 for dedicated accounts. Year to date we have taken \$50,000.00 out of the Money Market fund. We probably have 14 months before our cash reserves run out. So far, we have made \$1,095.52 on nine nights of Bingo, \$597.50 on carwash fundraiser, \$1,930.00 on our GoFundMe page in thirteen months, \$2,425.00 on group income and \$1,500.00 on e-bike raffle. This is a total of \$7,548.02 in additional income. Our envelope income year to date was well under budget. Continue to watch for ways to give to our ministries!
