We try to go to church whenever we are on vacation and this is the first time we felt truly welcomed as guests and not just as potential members. We were warmly welcomed (and shown) to fellowship time after, and they chatted with us (even though several people needed to meet for a council meeting).

Outreach Food4Life Food Pantry/Clothing Closet News

We take pride in bringing food and hope to our neighbors in need.

In the Sunday bulletin we list a food item that the food pantry is in need of. The item changes each month. The item for October is cereal. The item for November again will be cereal.

In September the food pantry served 89 families which consisted of 212 adults and 77 children. We welcomed 10 new guests.

We received 73 donations from members, neighbors, companies and another food pantry.

We are so grateful to our volunteers. We have 26 volunteers of which 5 are not members of Resurrection. Our volunteers spent 209 hours of their time working very hard to make this ministry successful. Everyone is invited to stop in on a Monday morning to see hard our volunteers work. We have received an enormous amount of clothing donations and are in need of volunteers to help sort through all of the approximately 20 bags and eliminate the ones that are not suitable to offer to our guests. Sept results show a gain in our investments of \$239.19. Envelope income was under budget by (\$4,810.42) for the month & under budget (\$37,197.75) for the year. Expenses were under budget by (\$15.50) for the month & under budget by (\$5,713.93) for the year. Our cash position as of 9/30/25 is \$80,653.40 in total cash assets, spread across our Money Market Fund, CD and Checking Account. Year to date we have taken \$45,000.00 out of the Money Market fund. We probably have 12 months before our cash reserves run out. So far, we have made \$854.00 on six nights of Bingo, \$597.50 on carwash fundraiser and \$1,730.00 on our GoFundMe page in ten months. This is a total of \$3,181.50 in additional income. Our envelope income, given year to date, is well under budget, but we have three more months to make up for the shortfall. If you are behind in your giving this would be a great time to catch up. Continue to watch for ways to give to our ministries!
