Despite what the Hallmark Channel, 93.9 Lite FM, and all the retail stores and commercials say, the Christian season of Christmas begins on Christmas Eve and lasts for twelve days, ending on January 6. (No, the twelve-day season of Christmas didn't start with the song; it was the other way around). The time before Christmas is Advent, a season of preparation for Christmas. We prepare for celebrating the birth of Jesus by remembering the longing of the Jewish people for a Messiah. The Advent season reminds us of how much we also need a Savior today. We look forward to our Savior's second coming even as we prepare to celebrate his first birth at Christmas. The word 'Advent' comes from the Latin word 'adventus,' which means 'coming' or 'visit.' In this season, we keep in mind both "advents" of Christ, the first in Bethlehem and the second yet to come.

I loved Christmas when I was young, partly because it celebrated the birth of Jesus, but mostly because it was a giant party in which I received lots of presents. Like many kids, I had a calendar that – starting December 1 – I would mark off the dates until I could open those presents. In a sense, Advent is a bit like my boyhood calendars, though it has a much more serious purpose. It's meant to get us ready, not for a present-opening party, but for a transformational celebration of the birth of Jesus.

Advent doesn't get much attention compared to Christmas, though interest in Advent is growing steadily in many churches and Christian homes. That's not to say everybody is an "Adventophile," a lover of Advent. Some Protestants ignore Advent because it isn't taught in Scripture and because they associate it with Roman Catholicism. Secular culture ignores Advent because there isn't much money to be made here. I suppose you might be able to make a few bucks selling purple and pink candles, but this isn't going to thrill most retailers.

I think, however, there are lots of good reasons to pay more attention to Advent. That's why we will have Wednesday Advent services (Dec. 6, 13, & 20) at 1:00 PM (in person) and 7:30 PM (virtually). I hope you'll join us as we ponder the question "How Does a Weary World Rejoice?"

And a side note: despite what many people say, Christmas isn't about family; it's about Jesus! That's why we will have our regular service on December 24 that celebrates the 4th Sunday in Advent, along with a 4:00 PM family-friendly Christmas Eve service and our choir concert and evening service that begin at 10:30 PM.

Our next Council meeting will be December 11, 2023 at 6:00 PM.



October results show a loss in our investments of (\$3,015.59). Envelope income was over budget by \$589.00 for the month & over budget \$6,211.95 for the year. Expenses were under budget by \$1,102.18 for the month & under budget by \$2,912.36 for the year. Our cash position as of 10/31/23 is \$159,386.95 in total cash assets, spread across our investment, Money Market, Operating Accounts and other investments. The stock market was down a little in October. Hopefully it will go up the rest of the year.
