Resurrection Lutheran Church is called by God to reach beyond our walls and share the Good News, bringing Christ to the world, through Prayer, Love and Action.

But understand this: if the owner of the house had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and would not have let his house be broken into. (Matthew 24:43 NRSV)

Lately I've heard many people (not just at RLC) talk about getting together with their children or grandchildren. Sometimes when I've heard about people preparing to visit someone outside their "bubble," I'll ask, "When was the last time they got tested?" Too often I get the responses, "Oh, they are very careful. They don't have any symptoms. I'm sure they don't have COVID." Here's the thing: without being tested regularly, there is no way to know if someone has COVID-19. An older couple I know got together with one of their children and family around Thanksgiving. They didn't know that someone in that family was positive. Not only did the offspring's family start showing symptoms, the older parents and another sibling became symptomatic, with the sibling and one parent being hospitalize.

Jesus told his disciples to be vigilant because no one knows when the Son of Man is going to show up. The same can be said about COVID-19. We must be vigilant and do all we can to limit our chances of catching it and spreading it to others. There are two things I want to encourage everyone to do to be vigilant:

1) Get fully vaccinated. Whether you want to do a booster or not is up to you. There is a lot of misinformation out there. Trust the experts who say it is safe and the best way for us to beat COVID-19; 2) Wear your mask when you are in a public place or around people whose vaccination status is unknown.

You never know when COVID-19 may break into your home, even when you trying to do your best. Please continue to be vigilant.

Financial Summary November 2021

November results reflect a monthly shortage in envelope income of \$1,520.00 compared to 2021 budget and an Investment loss of (\$4,874.830. With Plate and Interest Income our total income for the month was a negative (593.10). Expenses came in at (\$12,326.33) over budget for the month, leaving us with an overall loss of (\$12,919.43) for the month.

Our cash position as of 11/30/21 is \$358,652.10 in total cash assets, spread across our investment, Money Market, Operating Accounts and other investments. Our monthly expenses are averaging around \$10,260.00 a month and our average income is only around \$5,715.00 a month. If this continues, we will use \$54,540.00 of our investments to cover our short fall in our income for this year. So far year to date we have had good gains on our investments to help offset these shortfalls. It was a very tough month for the stock market and our investments.

In November we served 62 families consisting of 132 adults and 37 children. Our monthly numbers are increasing which means there are so many more people in need in the Franklin Park area. We are blessed to be able to help them.

We are forever grateful to those who donate food to meet the needs of our guests. Food Rescue US has been one of God's many blessings. It has been amazing that God knows when we are getting close to being out of meat. Meat always shows up when we need it. 44 different donations were received in November. Our much-appreciated dedicated volunteers worked 110 hours in November. Thank you so much to Pastor for picking up the Panera Bread and Costco items. Thank you also to Wayne and Donna Molley, Lindsay Vega and Jeff Davis for picking up at Costco on Saturday mornings. We are still looking for some volunteers to pick up food from Costco on Saturday mornings. Please call the office if you can help out with this.

One of our donors donated a commercial refrigerator. It is being used in the kitchen. Our kitchen is loaded with freezers and refrigerators and we use all of the space available with donations. We get a lot of produce from Costco.

Our clothing closet continues to be a blessing to our guests. Thanks to all who donate clothing items. We can always use winter coats, sweatshirts and sweatpants.

During the month of December, we will be giving out gift cards and turkeys to our guests to brighten their holiday.

We have had great responses so far from our members in supporting our donations to LSSI's holiday program again this year. We are asking our members to contribute to this program. Outreach will donate \$250.00.
