Moving Into the Fog: An Advent Word of Hope

As we finish our time with Pr. Kathy Nolte, looking at The Three Pathways, and turn the page into Advent, I can't help but think about how often life feels like stepping into the fog. Personally, I love walking (and driving) in the fog. For many, it's a fearful time. The road ahead isn't always clear. We wonder what's coming next – whether in our families, our work, our church, our community, or even the wider world. And let's be honest: the unknown can feel unsettling. But Advent is the perfect season to remind us that God's people have always lived with a sense of holy uncertainty. Think of: Mary, who said "yes" to God without knowing how it would all unfold; of the shepherds, startled awake by angels announcing good news they never expected; of the Magi, following a star without a map, trusting it would lead them somewhere important.

Advent is about waiting, watching, and trusting. It's about leaning into the mystery of what God is doing – even when we can't see the whole pathway. While we may have some fear about the future, Advent is when we long for God to break in. We want to know that God is at work. Each candle we light during Advent reminds us that we are called out of fear and into hope. We're reminded that Christ's light of good news is louder than fear, stronger than despair, brighter than the foggy future. And whichever pathway we choose for RLC, we don't walk this road alone. We walk it together, as a community of faith. When one of us feels uncertain, another can offer encouragement. When one of us feels weary, another can carry the load for a while. Church is a place where we remind each other that God is faithful, even when tomorrow feels hazy.

I love the image of the star guiding the Magi. They didn't know the destination, but they trusted the light they had. That's what faith looks like. We may not see the whole road ahead, but God gives us enough light for the next step. And step by step, we discover that Christ is already there, waiting to meet us.

As we move through Advent and our Advent theme "*What Do You Fear? Insisting on hope this Advent*," let's embrace the foggy future with courage and hope. Let's keep watch together, looking for signs of Christ's presence in our midst. And let's remember that the One who came as a child in Bethlehem will come again to make all things new. The future may be unknown, but it is never empty. It is filled with the presence of Christ – who walks with us, who goes before us, and who will never leave us. May this Advent season be for you a time of hope, courage, and joy as we step forward together into God's unfolding story.

Food Pantry/Clothing Closet News



We take pride in bringing food and hope to our neighbors in need.

In the Sunday bulletin we list a food item that the food pantry needs. The item changes each month. The item for December will be canned soup.

In October the food pantry served 111 families, which consisted of 237 adults and 81 children. We welcomed 14 new guests.

We received 61 donations from members, neighbors, companies and another food pantry.

We are so grateful to our volunteers. We have 26 volunteers of which 5 are not members of Resurrection. Our volunteers gave 220 hours of their time working very hard to make this ministry successful. Everyone is invited to stop in on a Monday morning to see hard our volunteers work.

We have received an enormous amount of clothing donations and need volunteers to help sort through all the approximately 30 bags and eliminate the ones that are not suitable to offer to our guests. Please contact Linda in the office or Sue Koevenig if you can help. Thank you to those who have stepped up to help already.

Oct results show a gain in our investments of \$199.41. Envelope income was under budget by (\$4,648.42) for the month & under budget (\$41,846.17) for the year. Expenses were over budget by \$1,300.90 for the month & under budget by (\$4,413.03) for the year. Our cash position as of 10/31/25 is \$73,472.33 in total cash assets, spread across our Money Market Fund, CD and Checking Account. Year to date we have taken \$50,000.00 out of the Money Market fund. We probably have 10 months before our cash reserves run out. So far, we have made \$927.00 on seven nights of Bingo, \$597.50 on carwash fundraiser and \$1,730.00 on our GoFundMe page in eleven months and \$2,425.00 on group income. This is a total of \$5,679.50 in additional income. Our envelope income, given year to date, is well under budget, but we have two more months to make up some of the shortfall. If you are behind in your giving this would be a great time to catch up. Continue to watch for ways to give to our ministries!
